#### **SHOW RULES**

- All exhibits must have been grown by and have been the property of the exhibitor for at least three
  months prior to the Show, except in classes 36-38 inclusive, in which they may be entered by or
  on behalf of the raiser and in the raiser's name.
- Exhibitors must send their entries for the main Show to the Show Secretary, Mr Alan Taylor on the form provided, to reach him no later than the first post on the Thursday before the Show. Late entries will be at the discretion of the Show Secretary.
- 3. No exhibitor may stage more than one entry per class, unless otherwise stated.
- 4. All exhibits must be staged at the time stated in the Show schedule.
- The Society's Shows will be judged in accordance with the latest N.D.S. Classified Directory of Dahlias, including single bloom classes (except Classes 33-35). The decision of the judges in respect of the relative merits of the exhibits shall be final.
- 6. Any protests must be lodged in writing with the Committee within one hour of the Show opening. A fee of £1 must accompany the protest. This will be refunded should the protest be upheld.
- 7. All exhibits must be grouped or staged according to the direction of the Committee.
- 8. The Committee will not be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibitor's property or exhibits.
- All Challenge Trophies are perpetual and may be held for nine months and must be returned to the Show Secretary at the May Plant Sale.
- 10. Judges can withhold prizes at their discretion.
- Entry cards will be provided at shows and must be placed face downwards at the side of the exhibit.
- 12. Only Stewards/Officials allowed in the Show whilst judging is taking place.
- 13. All Classes are open unless otherwise stated.
- 14. Any matters not provided for in the above rules will be dealt with by the Essex Dahlia Society Committee, whose decision will be final.
- 15. Any competitor winning a trophy may have the same engraved at their own expense provided the engraving is in keeping with and appropriate to the trophy engraved. Any questions in relation to engraving must be referred to the committee.

#### SPECIAL CLASSES

- Class 30. 1 vase, 3 Blooms, Small and/or Miniature, 3 distinct colours (As defined in the N.D.S. Classified Directory)
- Class 31. 3 vases. 1 Bloom per vase. Each vase to contain a separate classification. No variety to be used twice.
- Class 32. 6 Distinct Varieties in two vases, 3 Blooms in each vase.
- Class 33. A container of not less than 8 Dahlia Blooms, for colour and frontal effect.
- Class 34. A Basket of 12 Dahlias minimum, with natural dahlia foliage, maximum bench space allowed 950mm. To be judged 50% for quality and 50% for effect
- Class 35. A container of not less than 12 Dahlias for all around effect.

(Oversize Blooms will be allowed in 33 - 35)

#### SEEDLING AND SPORTS CLASSES

Exhibits may be entered by or on behalf of the raiser but must be in the raiser's name. More than one entry is allowed in these Classes.

- Class 36. 1 vase, 3 Blooms of a seedling not yet in commerce, to be judged for exhibition potential only. Giant or large varieties may be staged in 3 vases.
- Class 37. 1 vase, 3 Blooms, 2 Blooms of a sport not yet in commerce and one Bloom of the parent, to be judged for exhibition potential only. Giant or Large Blooms may be staged in 3 vases. Parent must be named.
- Class 38. 1 vase, 3 Blooms of a seedling or sport not yet in commerce, to be judged for garden or cut flower potential only.

#### INTERMEDIATE CLASSES

Only open to exhibitors who have not won a first prize in these classes or at any show at County or National level.

Class 39. **INTERMEDIATE CHAMPIONSHIP** 

2 vases, of 3 Blooms, 2 separate classifications. Giant or Large varieties must be staged in separate vases.

Class 40. Sponsored by A Ripley

3 Blooms, Giant or Large flowered. May be staged in separate vases.
